

The Bible account of creation answers a perhaps the most important
 question of our origin, "Who?" With this base, the rest of the Bible
tackles other question, "Why?", and "How?"

 in this verse and the Bible identifies the cause of our decline as the
loss of belief in creation as the cause.
Right at the end of time a critical message is to be given to the world.
 People are instructed to worship God as the creator. It is instructive,
that this warning echoes the very same phrase used in the fourth
commandment which instructs us to "Remember the Sabbath day, to
keep it holy."
We are called to humble acknowledgement of God as our maker
 knowing that we are His children and that He cares about us.
God is not only the creator of all things, He is the sustainer of all that
is created.
 The Bible teaches that Jesus was the one who actively spoke the
world into existence, and that we were made for Him.
 When we look at the natural world around us, we will see evidence of
genius, design, beauty and purpose that thrill and quiet the senses.

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SUMMARY PARAGRAPH

God has revealed in Scripture the authentic and historical account of His creative activity. He created the universe, and in a recent six-day creation the Lord made "the heavens and the earth, the sea, and all that is in them" and rested on the seventh day. Thus He established the Sabbath as a perpetual memorial of the work He performed and completed during six literal days that together with the Sabbath constituted the same unit of time that we call a week today. The first man and woman were made in the image of God as the crowning work of Creation, given dominion over the world, and charged with responsibility to care for it. When the world was finished it was "very good," declaring the glory of God.
