

When Adam was created God formed him out of clay and brought him to life by breathing into him the breath of life. With Adams first breath came thoughts, and with those thoughts began a lifelong process by which Adam modified his mind as a one of a kind individual. In reference to the judgment, the Bible indicates that there are record books in heaven that contain the record of each person's works, actions. words, and thoughts, their biography in intimate detail. All the things that make up a person's self identity or character is recorded like a computer back-up that we make to save critical information. This is what is used to determine our destiny for eternity. We may not be present when our eternal choice of eternal life or eternal death is ratified, so the record of our life, as recorded in the books, will stand in our stead. If saved our name is written in the Book of Life. This record of our name is much more than letters on a page but such a complete capturing of our essence that we can be recreated precisely as we once were, but without sin. When Jesus returns to resurrect, collect and bring His redeemed ones to heaven he will already know who he is getting. The Book of life has been completed with the names and specs, or recipes of all His saved ones. Though we never appeared for the investigation in person the record of our life/character was used to make the decision. Jesus cautions us to be more concerned with matters of eternity than with matters of this world.

At death the life power from God is lost and the body and mind decay

back to the dirt they were formed from.



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_On three separate occasions the Bible records the returning to or going forth of an individual's "Spirit." Not as some ghost-like floating being but as a one-of-a-kind custom created "recipe" of the individual sent to heaven to be kept on record for the upcoming resurrection when that individual will again be given a body and the vital power to live.

SUMMARY PARAGRAPH

Though many times the Bible uses the term spirit referring to the power of life from God or the breath of life, it is also used to refer to the total mental essence of who a person is with all their preferences, idiosyncrasies, personality traits, memories, knowledge, questions, emotions, etc, the sum total of them as an individual. Human spirits are not bodiless ethereal beings who can have an existence outside of a body but are pictures/recipes/back-ups/detailed records of each person as an individual, it is their self-identity. At death the spirit will be recorded by God and preserved in His records until the person is to once more be made into a living being. In the mean time between death and resurrection the individual is inactive, like a computer program awaiting someone to turn it on.
